Freedom of speech

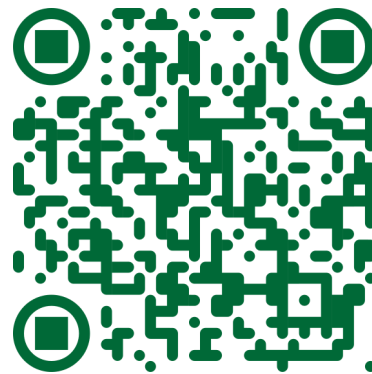
Freedom of speech is in the news almost every day, whether it's about political assassination in the USA or the right to say you support a proscribed direct action group or cancel culture on campus.

Greens in Exile



who are we?

The Green Party of England and Wales was founded on principles of fairness, democracy, and grassroots participation. It set out to “do politics differently”. It understood ecology, the ozone layer, climate change, overshoot and followed the science. But in 2016 it was captured by Gender Ideology – an idea that denies the basic biological science of sex. Gender ideologues took over and weaponised the national disciplinary committees to silence members and suspend or expel them.

Why did this happen?

Largely because less than 2% of our 70,000 members go to the conference – our sovereign forum. While hard-working Greens have been busy in local parties – getting councillors elected and making ecological progress locally – they have trusted party leaders at the national conference to steer the ship in the right direction.

The result?

Hard-working party members with many years of service and former roles on national committees have been sidelined and punished with so-called ‘no-fault suspensions’ and expulsions that lack due process.

Lost funds

The cash price the party has paid for discriminating against its members is high. It spent £1 million on legal fees over the four years to 2024 – settling cases out of court, getting legal advice that it then ignored, and losing cases. That’s 7.8% of the party’s average annual income during those years. More cases are coming.

Who are the Greens in Exile?

We are a group of Green Party members who have been suspended, expelled or forced to resign. Many of us have been targeted because of our belief that biological sex is real and immutable. Others have been punished for speaking out against abuses of the disciplinary process or governance failures.

For people and planet?

Exiles are committed to protecting the environment and social justice. We support voting reform; equality; and an end to the obsession with economic growth - all the aims and values that the Green Party used to hold dear. But today’s Green Party, despite increasing its MPs and Party membership, appears to have abandoned its environmental core and become just another left wing party.

Politically homeless

With the Green Party turning its back on protecting our environment, Exiles feel politically homeless. The loss of so many skilled and experienced members harms the Green Party and we call for the reinstatement of all those unfairly suspended or expelled. The Green Party is worth fighting for and it can be saved.
